



The Programme of European Neuroscience Schools Committee has created an Advisory panel on "Ethics and communicating neuroscience". Upon request, the list of its members will be made available to school organizers to facilitate the treatment and discussion of these topics to the school programme. The panel consists of leading figures in the field available to give lectures on these issues at the neuroscience schools supported or organized by the programme.

The task for the experts of the panel is to give one lecture every year at one of the schools of the programme, upon invitation of the scientific organizer. School organisers may decide to take advantage of the competences the board offers, although they are free to invite other experts in the field. Panel's members who decline an invitation for two consecutive years will be deemed to have resigned from the panel. The programme of the school should be communicated to the panel's expert at least nine months before the school is held, to allow enough time to plan activities. It would be desirable that experts stay at the school the time necessary to coordinate the action of the student work-groups.

The school covers travel (economy class) and accommodation expenses.

The aim of the initiative is to have a group of excellence willing to contribute on this crucial issue in response to the request of the scientific organiser, or on personal request of the *liaison* of the school and/or the Chair of the Programme of European Neuroscience Schools Committee
