NENS currently gathers 200 school programmes across 27 European countries that offer MSc, PhD and doctoral degrees in neuroscience.

...of interest for students enrolled in a NENS school:

- Exchange grants for training stays.
- NENS Graduate Fair, Best Poster Awards at the FENS Forum: 10 NENS students receive waived registration and present their poster at the Fair. 1 MSc and 1 PhD Student personal prize of 1.000 EUR.
- Slots in national courses: 20 FENS and IBRO-PERC stipends of 750 € each available every year for MSc and/or PhD to attend 6 selected courses organised by the NENS schools.

- Applicants are expected to spend a period of one to three months in another NENS lab of their choice in a different European country for the purpose of methodological training.
- The exchange grants cover travel and accommodation costs of up to EUR 3,000.
- Application deadlines: 15 April and 15
 October (midnight, Brussels time).

- Results of the applications are communicated in maximum 2 weeks following the application deadline.
- The awarded grant is provided following the training stay, based on the submitted report (1-2 pages) and the receipts reflecting their stay.
- After your training stay you become a NENS Student Alumni, your report and stay is listed on the NENS Student Alumni Directory.

Am I eligible to apply for a NENS exchange grant?

To be eligible, you have to be:

- MSc or PhD student enrolled in a NENS school programme and
- member of a FENS society
- Is my school programme a NENS member?
 - Check the NENS Programme Directory whether your school programme is a NENS member.






Statistics: NENS exchange grants 2007- June 2021


